I would like to nominate Sergeant Adam Nachreiner and his K9 partner Miya for the meritorious K9 track of the year. Due to their involvement in a track after a high speed vehicle pursuit, three subjects were arrested and a loaded firearm was recovered.

On February 25th, 2021 at around 2:20am a Monona Police Officer attempted to stop a vehicle that had been traveling at a high rate of speed westbound on highway 12 in the City of Monona. The vehicle fled from that officer at speeds reaching 100mph. After a four-mile pursuit, the suspect vehicle came to a stop in the middle of the road and three subjects fled from the vehicle on foot. One subject was caught by the pursuing officer after a foot chase.

Sergeant Nachreiner and K9 Miya responded and began a track which started in front of an apartment complex. The track went for approximately 3/4 of a mile through ice, large snowbanks, and frigid cold. K9 Miya located both suspects.

Two of the suspects arrested had warrants and the third was just recently released from prison on parole. A loaded firearm was located and it was discovered that the three suspects had been breaking into cars prior to the pursuit.

Without the help of K9 Miya and Sergeant Nachreiner, two of these suspects would have gotten away.

K9 Miya has served the city of Monona for nearly 11 years and is set to retire at the end of 2021. Although she is old, she is still known as the best tracking dog in our area. She has had a very successful career and my hope is to send her into retirement with a much deserved award.
